DEER RESISTANT

Living in harmony with wildlife is one of the most important aspects in gardening. While some prefer to feed and look after bees, butterflies, and critters, others want to keep them out. Whatever your preference is, we can all agree that there is one critter that will cause extensive damage to many landscapes: the whitetail deer. Whitetail deer are almost impossible to keep away. They have enhanced vision at night and can leap fences with ease which means they will tear up your garden while you are sound asleep. This brings up the million-dollar question: How can you enjoy the fruits of your labor if the deer keep enjoying it first? The answer is easy. Use plants that have deer resistant qualities. Read below to learn which plants have shown a resistance to deer.
